2016-17 Oranges &., Mildmay, Shoredich, London. Originally Commissioned by Genesis Housing Association and designed in 2015 but fabrication delayed until 2017 due to other building on the site. A 3m tall corten steel structure using the classical motifs of circle, rectangle and triangle, a contemporary interpretation of the historic buildings surrounding the site. Laser cut elements, back lit at night, reference key features of the area and its history, including the nursery rhyme "Oranges and Lemons".

2014-15 Portobello Wall (December 2014 – for 6 months): Commissioned by Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea to create a two dimensional public work along a 100m section of wall in Portobello Road. The brief is to create portraits – in the widest sense of the term – of people who have shaped the community of North Kensington over the last 100 years. We are currently in the Design stage, having worked with local historians, the Open Age group and an intergenerational project with a local school.

2011- 15: Flyer, Roneo Corner, London Borough of Havering. Completed 2014, installation delayed due external issues re land ownership - *Installed 21st March 2015*. A three dimensional public artwork with community engagement on this historic site, where the Roneo factory was situated (4m stainless steel and Coreten steel).

2002-10: Poplar Futures, Poplar East London a phased programme linking websites and an outdoor interactive projection system (8m screen) in the town centre (sister project to Future Town and Beyond)
